Alexander Sung has been an accomplished pianist and harpsichordist for more than 30 years, performing throughout the U.S., Europe, and Asia. He is highly praised for his passionate yet genuine interpretation and style. Mr. Sung first captured public attention in 1971 when, at age 24, he won fifth place at the International Harpsichord Competition in Belgium. The following year he came in fourth place at the International Johann Sebastian Bach Competition in Germany. He studied in Salzburg and Vienna under the tutelage of Heinz Scholz, Richard Hauser, and Isolde Ahlgrimm.
